I am writing on behalf of UCSF to express our deep respect for and continued partnership with Code Tenderloin. Over the years, we have worked closely together to address the needs of San Francisco's most vulnerable residents— particularly those experiencing homelessness, substance use, and behavioral health crises.

Saint Francis and St. Mary's Hospitals have partnered with Code Tenderloin over multiple years, most recently through the Tenderloin Night Navigator program to provide care navigation to substance-use patients from our emergency departments—including St. Mary's, and St. Francis. Prior to this partnership, nights and weekend connection for emergency department patients was a rare occurrence. Now we are able to extend the stabilization we provide in the Emergency Department by providing patients warm handoffs to aide in their recovery journey. The supports range from connection to crisis stabilization beds, sobering centers, and Medically-Assisted Treatment. Code Tenderloin brings deep credibility through their longstanding community engagement, which enables them to build trust with clients, and connect them to services beyond the hospital's reach.

Their growth in the public health area was most welcome and we were excited to learn about their newest plans to expand services into the Haight-Ashbury neighborhood through a new site at 730 Stanyan Street. This location will provide vital access to workforce development, reentry support, and wraparound services for a community facing significant housing and health disparities. We see this expansion as a natural and necessary extension of their proven, people-centered approach.

This program fills a critical gap in the city's safety net by offering support during the hours when most services are closed. With compassion, cultural humility, and deep community trust, Code Tenderloin's team helps individuals transition out of immediate harm and toward longer-term recovery and stability. Their work is not only life-saving—it is transformative.

We are proud to partner with Code Tenderloin and stand in full support of their efforts to expand their reach and deepen their impact across San Francisco. Their work is a vital part of a stronger, more responsive public health ecosystem.

SFCHC partners with Code Tenderloin on critical programs that provide low-barrier, trauma-informed care to individuals who are too often left behind by traditional systems. Through our work together at *The Living Room*, Code Tenderloin provides on-site housing navigation, workforce readiness, and individualized peer support to people navigating recovery and crisis. Their presence ensures that clients facing the toughest circumstances—especially those experiencing acute mental health needs or substance use disorders—have access to a trusted team that offers real solutions with dignity.

We also coordinate closely with Code Tenderloin's *Tenderloin Night Navigator (TLNN)* program, which operates seven nights a week. These interventions are not only compassionate, they are essential in preventing overdose, stabilizing individuals, and reducing the strain on emergency systems.
